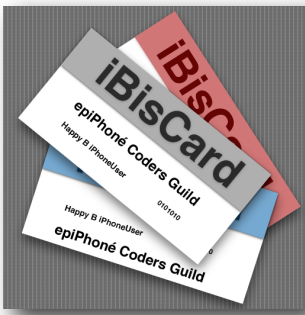


iBisCard User Guide

Version 1.0



iBisCard lets you create high-quality business cards directly from your iPhone contacts! **iBisCard** reads information (including picture!) from any contact you select, and generates a business card using one of the built-in design templates. You can edit any text from your contacts or ignore the contacts completely and simply type your info. **iBisCard** also lets you take a photo with your built-in camera or pick an image from your existing photos. Using iPhone OS 3.0 Cut&Paste capabilities, you can easily rearrange the contents of the card.

Defining Business Card Info

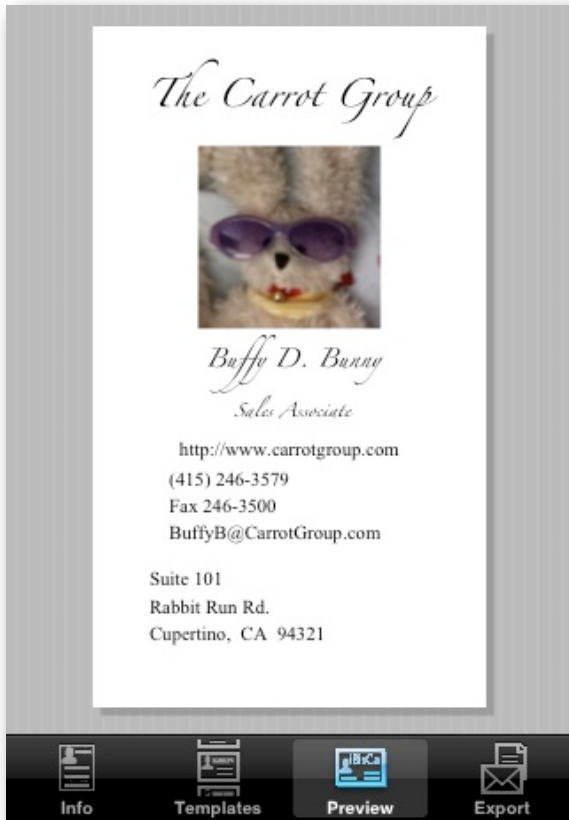
The information that will be used in your business card includes name, addresses, job information, telephone numbers and a picture. Not all card templates use all this information. In particular, most cards do not use a picture. To fill the **Info Form** fields using one of your contacts, simply tap the **Contacts Button** in the upper right corner. This will bring up a contacts selector that lets you choose from entries in your address book. If the contact you choose has an image, it will be imported. You can use this image, or, by tapping the **Camera Button** in the upper left corner, you can select an image from your stored photos, or use the camera to take a new picture. This allows you to replace your picture with a company logo, for example. After you have injected the contact information into the Info Form, you can edit to remove your middle initial, give yourself a promotion with a new job title, or add “Cell:” or “FAX:” in front of your phone numbers.

Design Templates

iBisCard displays design templates using the name of the **Info Form** field as a placeholder for the information you fill in. Thus where you see “Company” in a design template, your final card will have the contents of the company field. This makes it easy to change the configuration of the card. For example, to use your name instead of the company name: just type or paste your name into the “Company” field. You can leave any field blank, if you don’t want it on the card.

To select a design for your business card, scroll through the design templates until you find one you like, then tap it. This will bring you to the Preview page, where your card will be displayed full size, with your information filled in. If you want to make any changes, just tap “Info” at the bottom to jump back to the **Info Form**, edit the info, then tap “Preview” to see your changes. Selecting the template again is not necessary.

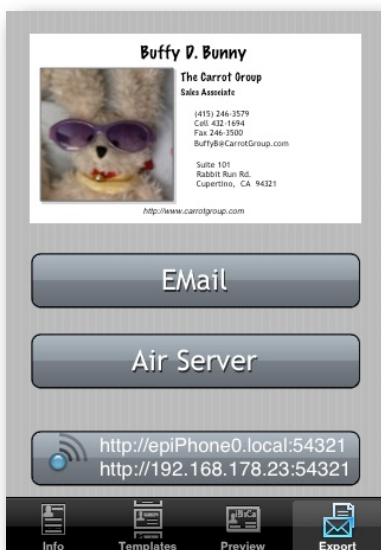
Previewing Your Business Card



The **Preview** page displays your business card with enough detail for you to get a good idea how your final printed cards will look. For designs in 'landscape' mode, the card will appear sideways, to maximize the visible detail on the screen of your device. **iBisCard** will not rotate its display when you rotate your device, so if you prefer to read text horizontally, by all means rotate your device!



Exporting Your Business Card






iBisCard offers two options for getting your new business card off of your iPhone/iPod and into the world, email and a built-in web server (**Air Server**) that will share your card with any web browser on your wireless network. Using email is the easiest, just tap the **Email** button, add a destination email address, and hit **Send**. Your card will be rendered to a JPEG format image in the exact size (1062x615) specified by VistaPrint.com for printing.

If you use the **Air Server** export option, **iBisCard** will also create a PDF-format version of your card in addition to the JPEG image. Just tap **Air Server** to save your card as JPEG and PDF and start **iBisCard's** WLAN-based server. The server allows any web browser on a connected computer to view and download the files you have exported. When the server is active, the indicator on the exports page will display the URLs you type into a web browser to reach your files. You can even view your exports using Safari on another iPhone.



The Air Server remains active as long as **iBisCard** is running, but changes to your card will only be saved to the JPEG/PDF exports if you tap the **Air Server** button again. This means you can edit other cards while viewing/downloading the cards with your browser, but you should be sure to download exports you want to keep before tapping **Air Server** to replace old cards with your latest changes. You will probably need to refresh your browser view to see these new files. For convenience, **iBisCard** also exports the current image you are using. You may have noticed that there are two URLs displayed in the Air Server indicator. The second, numeric IP address may be needed under certain network security settings. Because this URL will remain the same over multiple sessions, it may prove convenient to make a bookmark for it. Your browser should look something like this. Click on the file names to view them, or use the browser's 'Save As' function to download the files.
